The Update Message from the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers representing Flight Attendants in the 2339 Local Lodges

Contract 2010 – Last week, the Union served the company Section 6 notice “in accordance with the Railway Labor Act” with our intent to amend the contract and commence negotiations. This notice means the parties will be sitting down in the next 60 days to exchange comprehensive proposals regarding the changes the Union intends to seek. By no means will the Union allow the process of contract negotiations to be rushed, just to get something done. After receiving tens of thousands of proposals via the web site and by mail, it is evident that our flight attendant members have expressed a great interest in this round of negotiations. Beginning next week, the District Lodge will launch the “**Contract 2010**” webpage, which will be your main source for information on negotiations. Local Lodge websites will have a direct link to the “**Contract 2010**” web page to ensure easy access for all members.

2009 Bi-Annual District 142 Convention will be held in Kansas City, Mo., on October 19 -22, 2009. The convention will be called to order on Tuesday morning, Oct. 20, and it will adjourn on Thursday, Oct. 22. This gathering will be different from previous conventions. In addition to reports from Grand Lodge and District officers, we will hold breakout sessions followed by reports from several of our committees. Committees in action include the Education Committee, the Legislative Committee, the Communications Committee and the Ground and Flight Safety Committees. Delegates will choose the breakout sessions in which they want to participate. At the convention’s breakout sessions, the leaders of these committees will report on what they have done over the past year. Session participants will then discuss issues they want their committees to address in the next two years. At the end of the session, each group will approve the report that will be read to the entire convention. This participation by the delegates will benefit our entire membership and create more active committees. Delegates will return to their local lodges, many of which don’t have these committees, and help them improve service to their members.

- Reserve flight attendants continue to report problems with Scheduling and FIFO. Please note you must provide pairing information and any back up documentation to assist your Union representatives with conducting investigations. If you believe that a Scheduler has behaved in a non-professional manner you must supply us with date, time, and name of scheduler so that we can pull tapes to review the conversation.

National Group Protection Insurance will continue to be offered at the Houston and Newark bases in the Continental & ExpressJet crew rooms October 22-27 and November 4-7, 2009. Underwritten by American Bankers Life Assurance Company, you can elect to have accident; cancer; critical illness; or universal life insurance coverage for yourself and/or your family members. There will be representatives in the crew rooms to explain the coverage being offered for IAM members. Flight Attendants from all bases transiting through Houston during this time are welcome to enroll.

H1N1 Makes a Strong Comeback – Health experts expect the H1N1 to become much more wide spread in several areas of the United States. Fortunately, the seasonal flu has not been a factor to date and now is the time to take precautions to help prevent yourself and co-workers from becoming ill. Get your flu shots as soon as they become available. Wash your hands often, sneeze into your sleeve, remember to use gloves when picking up trash, use the sanitizer's that are provided for you and if you are sick, please stay home and don't pass it onto your co-workers. While H1N1 could mutate aggressively into a deadly pandemic killing millions, Dr. Margaret Chan of the World Health Organization, now admits that well into the flu season in the Northern Hemisphere that H1N1 has apparently not mutated. With that being said, if you suffer from a compromised immune system or have a chronic illness or are pregnant, you should take extra precautions and consult your doctor at the first sign of any flu like symptoms.
